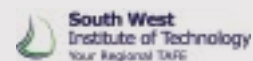

- > Employment advice and support
- > An accommodation referral service.

Institute staff will also be able to assist you with:

- > Advice on courses and pathways
- > Advice on changing your course/units/pathways
- > Updating your contact details (i.e. address, email, mobile numbers)
- > Overseas Student Health Care (OSHC) information
- > Information on public transport (buses and trains).

Orientation

When you arrive in Western Australia, you must attend an orientation session at your Institute.

At orientation you will:

- > Receive your class timetable
- > Be given a tour of your campus
- > Find out important information relating to your studies.

Facilities

Western Australian TAFE Institutes provide students with:

- > Well equipped libraries with access to internet resources
- > Cafeterias that offer a variety of hot and cold food and drinks
- > Links to recreational, social, religious and other facilities that make students feel at home.

Student ID Card

At orientation, you will be provided with a student ID card that gives you access to discounted public transport and a wide variety of entertainment and sporting facilities.

Safety

Perth is generally a safe city but students should always take precautions particularly when out and about at night. International student advisors can provide students ongoing support and advice during your stay.

The Western Australian Police can also provide you with assistance should you require it. For life threatening emergencies (police, fire and ambulance) call 000, or 112 from a mobile phone.

Accommodation

There are a variety of accommodation options available to international students studying in Western Australia including:

- > Temporary Accommodation
- > Rental Accommodation
- > Campus Living
- > Homestay

Temporary Accommodation

Temporary accommodation may be a good option for when you first arrive in Western Australia. There is a range of temporary accommodation on offer in Perth, which you can search for through the internet and book online. There are many backpacker hostels or budget hotels to choose from that range from \$30–\$150 AUD per night depending on whether you require shared or single rooms.

Rental Accommodation

Many students choose to share a rental house or apartment with other students as this reduces costs. The average rental price for a furnished room in share accommodation is around \$150 per week but can range from \$120–\$180 per week. This cost does not usually include electricity, water or gas.

You can also look in local newspapers such as The West Australian or The Sunday Times, where a large range of rentals are advertised. The International Student Centre at your Institute may be able to provide assistance in identifying suitable accommodation in one of the local suburbs.

Accommodation Checklist

- > Make sure you have read and understood the terms and conditions of any tenancy agreement before you sign.
- > If you pay a security deposit, make sure you obtain a receipt.

Campus Living Villages

Accommodation is available to TAFE international students on several different campus locations in the Perth metropolitan area, and regional Western Australia.

The **Edith Cowan University (ECU) Village Mt Lawley** is a short distance from the Central Institute of Technology Mt Lawley campus. The ECU Village is 10 minutes by bus from the centre of Perth and transport to other TAFE Western Australian Institutes including West Coast Institute and Polytechnic West. Rooms start from \$199 per person per week.

The **Murdoch University Village** is located only 1km from the Challenger Institute of Technology's Murdoch campus. Rooms start from \$168 per person per week.

The regional TAFE Institutes that offer on-campus student accommodation include the Durack Institute of Technology at **Pepperell Village**, and South West Institute of Technology at the **ECU Student Village Bunbury** where rooms start from \$185 per person per week.

Please note this accommodation is only available to students over 18 years old. If you are under 18 years old please see the section below for Under-age Students.

The prices listed above are for 2016 and are subject to annual review.

Homestay

Homestay allows students to live with an Australian family. This is very popular because you can make Australian friends, embrace the Australian lifestyle and improve your English. Homestay costs between \$265–\$300 per week, depending on your age and level of service provided. There is also a Homestay placement fee of \$240.

Bookings must be made at least two weeks in advance. Late bookings will incur additional fees.

Homestay options are:

- Full service > \$300 per week, includes 3 meals per day
- Half service > \$265 per week, includes 2 meals per day.

The fee also includes laundry, snacks, electricity and gas. For more information about Homestay and to make a booking, contact Australian Homestay Network (AHN) at **www.homestaynetwork.org**

Underage Students

All applicants can study at TAFE in the calendar year they are turning 18. For students under 18 years of age, once AHN has identified a Homestay family they will give these details to ETI, who will issue the Confirmation of Appropriate Accommodation and Welfare (CAAW) letter. The student will need to include this letter in their student visa application.

Sometimes parents have relatives or friends in Perth that they would like their child (under 18) to live with. For this to be approved parents need to provide evidence of a long-term family relationship with the proposed hosts. AHN will need to visit the home and ensure it is suitable and appropriate for the child, and all adults living in the home are required to provide Working with Children and Police Criminal Screening checks. This arrangement will need to be registered with AHN and fees do apply.

Airport Reception

Airport Pickup

Airport pickup can be arranged for students arriving in Western Australia at a cost of \$120. Students will be taken directly to their homestay family or temporary accommodation. Please contact AHN at www.homestaynetwork.org to organise this service. A taxi from the airport to central Perth costs approximately \$40. An airport bus costs approximately \$15, and can drop passengers at central city hotels.

Employment

You may decide to find a part time job to increase your income and gain work experience whilst undertaking your studies. Your international student visa allows you to work while you are in Australia. International students are allowed to work up to 40 hours per fortnight during each semester and unlimited hours during semester breaks.

You may be able to earn \$15 - \$20 per hour depending upon your skills and experience, but you should not rely on these earnings to pay tuition fees. You can discuss work options with the International Student Coordinator at your Institute after you have started your course so that you can assess them in relation to your course commitments and workload.

Sample Weekly Budget (AUD)

- > Rent - shared accommodation (average) \$70 - \$250
- > Gas + electricity \$60 - \$100
- > Phone + internet \$20 - \$50
- > Food + eating out \$80 - \$200
- > Public transport \$10 - \$50
- > Clothing + entertainment \$50 - \$100
- > Clothing + entertainment \$50 - \$100

Total \$290 - \$750 (average \$520)

Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC)




All international students studying in Australia are required to pay Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC) for the entire duration of their student visa.

Health Cover Costs

ETI will only process payments for Bupa. If you wish to use another provider, you will need to make your own payment arrangements and show evidence of the payment to the Department of Immigration and Border Protection when you apply for your visa.

Transport

Western Australia has a large network of public transport options. Perth Airport is the gateway to Western Australia and from the airport you can connect to a network of regional airports located across our large state.

Public Transport

Public transport in the Perth metropolitan area, including buses and trains, is provided by Transperth, part of the State Government's Public Transport Authority (PTA).

Free Travel in Central Perth

Perth city has a Free Transit Zone for buses and a SmartRider Free Transit Zone for trains allowing you to travel for free within the boundaries of the zone!

Perth, Fremantle and Joondalup also have Central Area Transit or CAT bus services that allow you to travel for free within the central areas of Perth, Joondalup and Fremantle.

Discount Travel for Students

Students undertaking full time study at TAFE institutions are entitled to concessional travel entitlements on Transperth and regional town bus services with their Tertiary SmartRider.

Driving

To drive in Western Australia you will require a valid driver's licence. You may be able to drive in Australia if you have a current licence from your home country. If your overseas licence is not valid you must apply for a West Australian licence if you wish to continue driving.

Taxis are used throughout Perth and can be caught from a sign-posted taxi rank outside train stations, shopping centres, hotels, shopping and tourist areas. It is also possible to make a phone booking to order a taxi. Please note that catching a taxi on public holidays and at night, may have an additional charge.

Walking + Cycling around Perth

There are many great walking and cycling tracks around Perth. You will find these along the Swan River in Perth and in many of the outer suburbs. You may even be able to cycle or walk from your accommodation to your Institute. However please remember, in Australia you must wear a cycle helmet at all times and use lights if you cycle at night.

STUDYING AT TAFE

All courses offered by TAFE Institutes to international students are registered on the **Australian Government Commonwealth Register of Institutions and Courses for Overseas Students (CRICOS)** and are full time. Full time study for international students at TAFE consists of around 20 hours of training per week.

TAFE Institutes in Western Australia deliver a range of courses that are developed in consultation with industry and are reviewed regularly to ensure that students graduate with the skills and knowledge required for a successful employment outcome.

Where there is a note in the course information which indicates that a course is under review, this may mean a change in course number, change in course content and/or the introduction of new learning and delivery styles. The new course will continue to be industry focused and get students started on their career pathway.

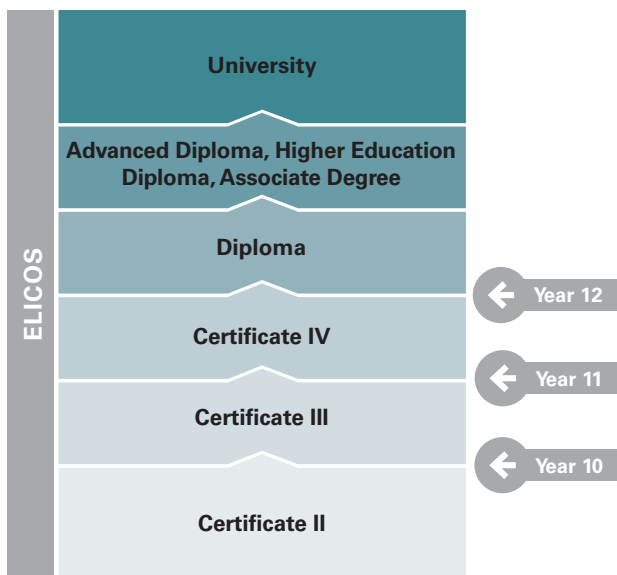
Qualification Levels

In each TAFE program area there can be multiple qualification levels. Each qualification level represents a combination of skills that enable the graduate to perform various job related tasks to a certain standard.

From lowest to highest, the qualification levels are:

- > Certificate I
- > Certificate II
- > Certificate III
- > Certificate IV
- > Diploma
- > Advanced Diploma, Higher Education Diploma, and Associate Degree.

Each qualification level takes a different length of time to complete.



The diagram shows how School, TAFE and University are connected and the pathways between them. Please note that students may be required to start at a lower qualification level than years of schooling shown above. Please refer to the outline for your selected course in the courses section of this guide.

The years of schooling shown in this diagram refers to the Australian education system. For your country's equivalent please see the Admission Requirements section on page 20.

Certificate to Advanced Diploma

If you have completed 10 or 11 years of school, you will most likely begin your studies at Certificate III level.

If you have completed 12 years of school, you may be able to start at Certificate IV or Diploma level. Each industry area is different so please refer to the specific course information located in the courses section of this guide.

Higher Education/Associate Degrees

Higher Education course options will prepare you for your chosen career or continue your pathway to higher levels of study.

These courses are developed in conjunction with industry to ensure you gain skills and knowledge that will be valued by employers. Higher Education students can expect quality teaching and work-ready qualifications.

A Higher Education Diploma or Associate Degree will provide you with a pathway into Bachelor Degree programs with leading Western Australian universities.

English Language (ELICOS) Courses

Students who need to improve their English can package an English course with their TAFE program. A range of English courses are available through the English Language Intensive Course for Overseas Students (ELICOS) Centres at Central Institute of Technology and Polytechnic West.

All TAFE programs require a minimum level of English proficiency for entry, this will depend on any English studies you have previously completed.

Competency Based Training (CBT) + Assessment

Training Packages + CBT

Training packages are used as the basis for most of the Vocational Education and Training (VET) programs delivered by TAFE Institutes throughout Australia. A training package is a set of nationally endorsed standards and qualifications for recognising and assessing people's skills in a specific industry, industry sector or enterprise. They are developed by national Industry Skills Councils (ISCs) in consultation with industry and are not owned by an individual training provider.

Training package qualifications are made up of a set of core and elective units of competency. These units of competency outline the skills and knowledge students must acquire if they are to successfully complete a qualification. These competencies are delivered by qualified trainers using a Competency Based Training (CBT) approach. CBT places emphasis on what a person can do in the workplace as a result of completing a program of training.

Competency Based Assessment

Competency Based Assessment is the process of collecting evidence and making judgements as to whether a competency has been achieved. The purpose of assessment is to confirm that a student can perform to the standard expected in the workplace as outlined in the competency. The evidence may be collected by observing a student undertaking a task in the workplace, through a formal theory test, the completion of a project and so on.

If students believe that they are already competent, they can apply for Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL). RPL is the term used to describe a number of assessment processes that formally recognise the competencies an individual has acquired through formal or non-formal learning, work experience and/or life experience. Results + Awards

After you have undergone assessment, you will receive one of the following results:

Result code	Result	Definition
CO	Competent	You have met the requirements of the unit of competency.
H	Hold	You have not yet met the requirements of the unit of competency and may need to re-submit or re-sit an assessment.
R	Re-enrol	You have not met the requirements of the unit of competency and must re-enrol and undertake this unit again. Please note that fees are incurred when you re-enrol into a unit(s).

These results will be issued to you as a Statement of Attainment at the end of each Semester of study. If you are deemed not yet competent in any units of competency, your lecturers will give you feedback and provide you with guidance which you can apply when you re-submit assessments.

All students have the opportunity to appeal their results and, if necessary, be reassessed.

When you have been deemed competent in all of the units of competency in your qualification, you will be issued with an Award that is for example, if you have been studying a Diploma program, you will be issued with your Diploma Certificate.

Industry Training

All TAFE courses are designed in partnership with industry to ensure training programs meet the needs of employers. Because of this, TAFE courses involve more "hands on" activities and practical experience than university. These activities may include workshops and projects as well as work experience placement.

UNIVERSITY PATHWAYS

START YOUR STUDIES AT TAFE

Many students choose to start their studies at a Western Australian TAFE Institute, apply for university entrance towards the end of their Diploma/Advanced Diploma studies and then gain credit for the work they have done.

On completion of TAFE and university you will have two qualifications that are attractive to employers and that will give you a competitive edge in the global job market.

The advantages of starting your studies at TAFE include:

- > An industry focused pathway to further study if you do not meet university entry requirements
- > Smaller class sizes with extra English and academic support
- > You will gain practical, employment focused skills that will complement your degree
- > May reduce your study load, course duration and fees when you enrol into your university degree
- > May allow you to apply for Streamlined Visa Processing (SVP) and therefore be eligible to apply for a 573 student visa for the entire duration of your TAFE and University programs

University Credits

In the course section of this guide, you will find information about advanced standing or credit transfer arrangements that TAFE Western Australia Institutes have with Western Australian Universities.

Credit Points

Each university has a different credit system where students need a certain number of credit points to be eligible for a Bachelor degree.

Agreements between TAFE Institutes and the universities specify the credits that a student will receive on transfer from a Diploma or Advanced Diploma to Degree course. This credit transfer may reduce the duration and the cost of the degree program.

To gain the equivalent of one year of advanced standing, you need the following credit points:

- > Curtin University = 200 credit points;
- > Edith Cowan University (ECU) = 120 credit points;
- > Murdoch University = 24 credit points
- > University of Western Australia (UWA) = 48 credit points

Streamlined Visa Processing (SVP)

The Australian Government has approved some education providers in Australia to offer courses that students can access under the Department Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) Streamlined Visa Processing (SVP) arrangements.

Under SVP arrangements, students can access faster, simpler visa processing.

Education and Training International (ETI) has been approved by DIBP as an SVP provider for:

> **Advanced Diploma courses**

> **TAFE to University packaging**

ETI needs to ensure that any student intending to study at a TAFE Western Australia Institute is a genuine student and Genuine Temporary Entrant (GTE) in line with Immigration requirements.

Advanced Diploma (SVP)

Students who apply for an Advanced Diploma course are now assessed under SVP. This process will only apply to students who study a qualification that ends in an Advanced Diploma.

You can commence your course at a lower level such as Certificate III or Diploma as long as your highest level qualification is an Advanced Diploma course.

TAFE Western Australia Advanced Diploma courses can also provide entrance to and credit transfer into university courses. The Advanced Diploma courses can be viewed in the course information section.

TAFE to University Packaging

If you are considering studying an undergraduate degree after your TAFE program, you have the option of packaging that course with Curtin University, Edith Cowan University (ECU), Murdoch University or the University of Western Australia (UWA).

You can commence a Diploma, Advanced Diploma or Associate Degree pathway with TAFE and, on completion, transfer to your chosen university to complete your degree program. When you apply for a packaged program you will receive a student visa for the whole period of your study.

Packaged programs 'lock' you into a university and a degree program and it is difficult to change your university and visa subclass once you have commenced.

It is important that you discuss your options with an approved ETI Education Agent before making a decision to package your program.

Students undertaking a packaged program should note that their principal course is the university program.

There are strict immigration requirements that relate to changing provider or visa subclasses if you have opted for a streamlined visa.

Please note: To submit an SVP application with an agent, you must use a Registered Agent of the relevant University and Education + Training International (ETI). For a list of education agents in your country please visit: www.eti.wa.edu.au/find-an-education-agent

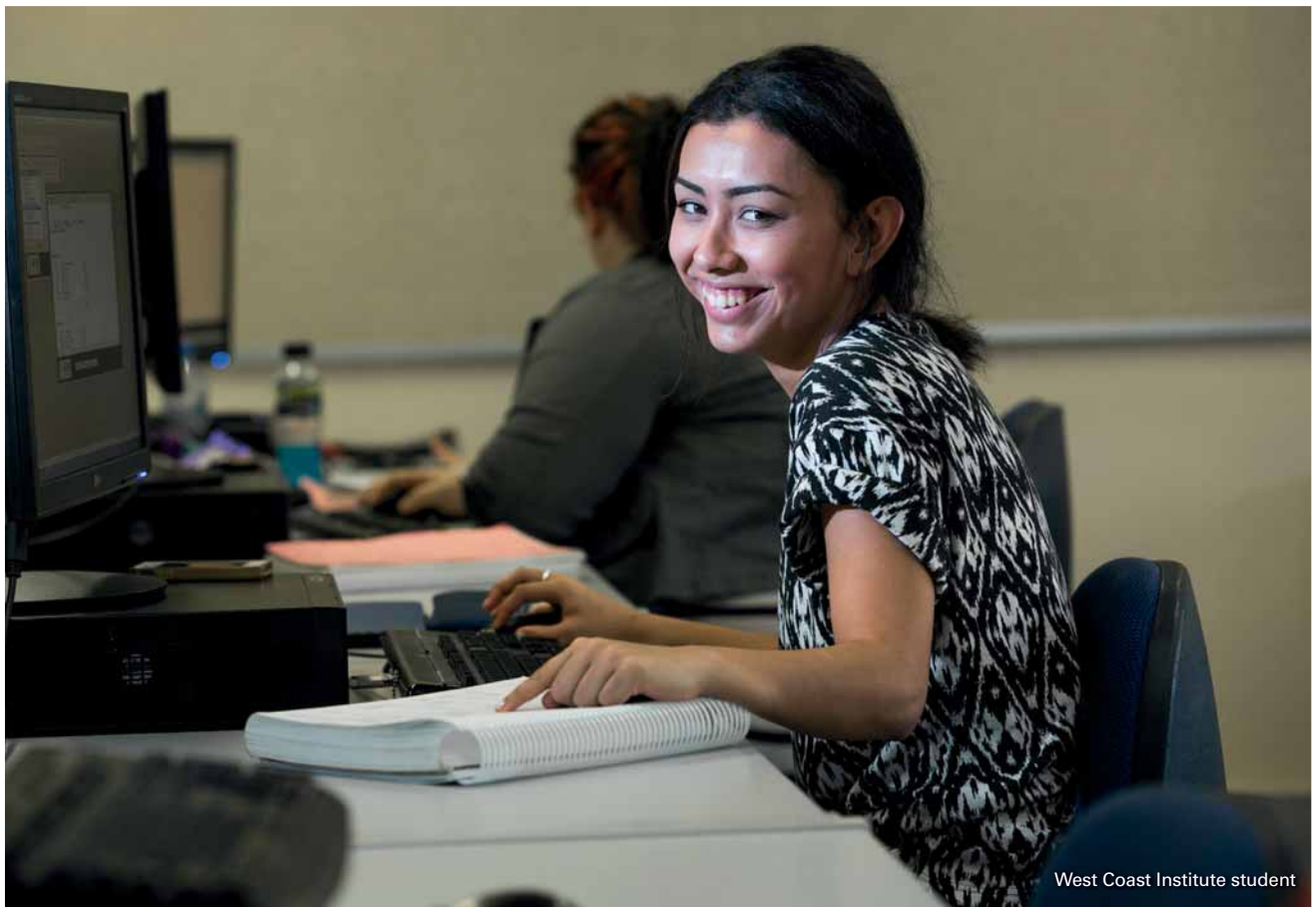

Description

This course is designed for those who have the desire and ambition to become a Commercial Pilot and work in the Aviation Industry. 1. Find a Course

You can choose from over 250 TAFE courses. Visit the course catalogue at www.eti.wa.edu.au/course-catalogue for information on courses.

2. Check the Entry Requirements

All applicants can study at TAFE in the calendar year that they are turning 18. There are no English or Academic entry requirements to begin our English (ELICOS) programs. However, all of our Certificate and Diploma courses have specific Academic and English proficiency requirements. Refer to the courses section in this guide and the Admission Requirements and English Language Requirements on pages 24-28 for more details.

Make sure that you can meet the entry requirements of your chosen course before you proceed to the next step in the application process.

Application + Acceptance Deadlines

Deadlines for submitting applications to Education and Training International (ETI) for admission to TAFE courses depend on the assessment level countries students are applying from and whether or not students are applying on or offshore. Level 3 offshore applications should apply early for places, as visa processing can take more time.

Students should also be aware that there are deadlines for accepting offers and making fee payment. Confirmation of Enrolments (CoEs) will not be issued after the cut-off date. This is to ensure that students leave a reasonable time to get their visa and arrive in time for orientation and the start of classes.

3. Submit your Application

You can apply to study at a TAFE Institute by completing your application online at: www.eti.wa.edu.au/apply. You can apply directly to ETI or you can apply through one of ETI's approved education agents. You pay the same fees whether you apply directly to us or through one of our education agents.

Many students choose to apply directly, especially as they can use this guide and the ETI website to find all the information they need and submit their applications online. Other students choose to use education agents to assist them in preparing and submitting their study and visa applications. If you do not already have an agent, you can find an approved ETI agent on our website: www.eti.wa.edu.au/find-an-education-agent

Receive Your Letter of Offer

Once we have received your application and supporting documentation, we will assess your eligibility to study your selected course(s). If eligible and there are places available we will send you a 'Letter of Offer'. This letter will be sent to you directly or through the education agent you have nominated according to your instructions on the application form.

If we have not received all of the required supporting documentation from you, for example certified copies of certificates etc. then your Letter of Offer will have conditions listed noting the information you still need to provide.

There are many high demand courses that fill up very quickly, so you should consider returning your acceptance and payment promptly.

Please note your place is subject to availability at the time of acceptance and payment.

You must allow sufficient time before your course starts to obtain your visa and make arrangements to come to Western Australia. Usually at least 3 - 6 months is needed to do this.

4. Accept your Offer and Pay

To accept your Offer, you must return your signed Letter of Acceptance with:

- > Supporting documentation that you were requested to supply in your Letter of Offer (i.e. conditions).
- > Payment of your schedule of fees, as indicated in your Letter of Offer.

5. Receive your Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) and apply for your Student Visa

Subject to the availability of places after you have signed and returned the Letter of Acceptance, made full payment and met any conditions, we will provide you with a Confirmation of Enrolment (CoE) which you will need in order to apply for a student visa at the Australian High Commission or Embassy in your country.

You must have a student visa in order to enter Australia and commence your studies.

If you need help obtaining your visa and other aspects of moving to Australia, which may be best provided in your own country or language, then you might like to use the services of one of ETI's approved education agents.

6. Receive your Visa and come to Australia to commence your studies

When your student visa has been granted, you are ready to come to Western Australia to begin your course. Please take note of the Orientation dates for your Institute as you will be provided with important information that you need to know to successfully complete your course of study and to make the most of your time in Western Australia.

You must arrive in Australia prior to the commencement of your course or your enrolment may be deferred to the next available intake and you may have to return home.

Enrolment Conditions

1. ESOS Act and National Code

The Australian Government wants international students in Australia to have a safe, enjoyable and quality study experience. Australian laws promote quality education and consumer protection for overseas students. These laws are known as the ESOS (Education Services for Overseas Students) framework and they include the ESOS Act and the National Code. For information about ESOS and your rights as an international student in Australia please go to the Australian Education International (AEI) website: **www.aei.gov.au**

2. Code of Conduct

Student Responsibilities

International students should ensure that they:

1. Meet TAFE course requirements and meet the requirements of the *Australian Government's Department of Education and Department of Immigration and Border Protection (Immigration) Course Progress Policy*.
2. Notify the International Student Coordinator at their TAFE Institute of their residential address within seven days of arrival and of any change to their residential address within seven days of any change.
3. Notify the International Student Coordinator at their TAFE Institute immediately if they want to terminate their studies, withdraw from their course, or there are any changes to their visa status.
4. Pay the required fees when an Offer of Placement is made or owing on receipt of invoice.
5. Not engage in activities that contravene Australian law. Students who do so will be terminated and reported to Immigration.
6. Not engage in plagiarism which is a serious offence and may result in cancellation of your enrolment.
7. Allow other students to learn in a safe and suitable environment.

In the case of students who are under 18 years of age, the parent or guardian must ensure compliance with all of the above.

Provider Responsibilities

Education + Training International and TAFE Institute Responsibilities:

1. Provide international students with the same level of instruction and educational services as normally provided to Australian students enrolled at TAFE.
2. Provide an orientation program for international students.
3. Monitor the welfare of students and provide counselling and ongoing support while enrolled at TAFE.
4. Appoint one or more staff members to act as the point of contact for students.

3. Changing Course and/or Campus

If you decide you would like to change the course you are studying, or attend classes at a different campus of the Institute you are enrolled at, you should contact the International Centre at your Institute to discuss whether this is possible and how this may affect your visa.

If you choose to proceed with a change of course or campus you will need to complete a *Change of Course Application Form* or a *Change of Campus Request Form*, which can be downloaded from www.eti.wa.edu.au/current-students/policy-and-forms. You will be contacted by ETI via email during this process and advised in writing of the outcome.

4. Transferring to a different Institute

If you have not completed 6 months of study in your principal course* with ETI and wish to transfer to another provider, you must complete a *Release Letter Request Form*.

**The principal course is defined as the highest qualification in a package of courses.*

Release from a course of study will only be granted in exceptional circumstances relating to your welfare. These circumstances are defined as a sudden change beyond your control that impact plans for on-campus study in Australia. Such circumstances must be supported by documentary evidence.

If you are under 18 years of age you must provide a letter from your parent/guardian to support your application for release.

Applications for release can be made by completing a *Release Letter Request Form*, which can be downloaded from: www.eti.wa.edu.au/policy-and-forms

Your application must detail the reason(s) for early release, full details of the new Institute and course you will be enrolling into, and a valid offer of enrolment from the new Institute. If your release is approved you will be issued a release letter. You must then contact Immigration to notify them that you have changed provider, as this may affect your visa. If your release is refused you will receive a written reply outlining the reasons for refusal. You will have 20 days to appeal the decision.

5. Course Progress

As an international student, if you do not achieve satisfactory course progress you may not be able to continue your studies.

To show that you are making every effort to achieve satisfactory course progress, it is very important that you attend all scheduled classes.

If you are unable to attend class, you should contact your lecturer and the International Centre at your Institute.

If you do not attend classes and do not notify the International Centre, then your continuing enrolment and visa may be at risk.

If you have not been attending classes and/or not completing assessments, then your lecturers are required to notify the International Centre that you are at risk of unsatisfactory course progress. A member of the International Centre staff will then contact you to discuss your progress and work with you to put in place a plan to help you to get your studies back on track.

If you have made unsatisfactory progress, that is, achieved less than 50% of the course requirements in two consecutive study periods i.e. two consecutive terms; then your enrolment may be cancelled and a report sent to the Immigration which may affect your visa.

6. Attendance requirements - ELICOS Students

If you are enrolled in an English Language Intensive Courses for Overseas Students (ELICOS) program, you must attend 80% of all timetabled classes. If you do not attend, are more than 20 minutes late to class or you leave class before the scheduled finish time; then you will be marked absent. If you cannot attend for two or more days you must obtain a medical certificate and provide a copy to the International Centre at your Institute.

If you attend less than 80% of your classes, you will be notified in writing by a member of the International Centre staff and you will be required to attend a meeting to discuss your unsatisfactory attendance. You may bring a support person with you to this meeting.

If you have unsatisfactory attendance that is, attended less than 80% of all timetabled classes; your enrolment may be cancelled and a report sent to Immigration which may affect your visa.

7. Late Arrival

Students must ensure that they arrive on or before the commencement date indicated on their Letter of Offer.

Late starts will only be granted in exceptional circumstances, where evidence can be provided.

Approval for a late start must be obtained and granted prior to your course commencement date. Students who cannot arrive on time may be required to defer their enrolment to the next available intake.

8. Deferral or Suspension of Study

Your enrolment can be deferred or temporarily suspended for compassionate grounds or exceptional circumstances, such as:

- > severe medical illness to you or a member of your family;
- > death in your family;
- > medical condition while undertaking your studies including pregnancy;
- > a natural disaster which affects you or your family.

Prior to lodging your application to defer it is recommended you contact the Department of Immigration and Border Protection (DIBP) to discuss how this may impact your visa. Should you decide to proceed you must complete the Application to Defer, which can be downloaded from www.eti.wa.edu.au/policy-and-forms

Your application must detail your reason(s) for requesting to defer or temporarily suspend your studies and include documents to substantiate exceptional circumstances.

If you are under 18 years of age you must provide written support from your parent or legal guardian to support your application.

When a deferral or temporary suspension is approved, you will be advised in writing of the deferral period and your new commencement date. Immigration will be informed of the change relating to your course of study. This may affect your visa status.

Please note: Should you wish to defer one (1) commencement of your studies you will not be required to provide evidence of compassionate or exceptional circumstances. Deferral of your enrolment may result in an increase of Tuition, Resource and Material fees. If you defer your enrolment, you will be required to pay the fees which apply at your new commencement date. Confirmation of Enrolments (CoEs) for the revised period will not be issued until all additional fees and charges are paid in full.

If the deferral or temporary suspension is refused, you will be advised in writing and you will have 20 days to lodge an appeal.

9. Refunds and Withdrawals

After you have completed your enrolment your circumstances may change which means you may have to withdraw. To withdraw from your course, you must complete a *Refund and Withdrawal Form*, which can be downloaded from: www.eti.wa.edu.au/current-students/policy-and-forms

When you have completed the form and provided any supporting documentation it will be processed. Please note that processing of your withdrawal, and any fee refund you may be due can take up to 4 weeks.

10. Complaints and Appeals

Talk to someone at your TAFE Institute

If you have a complaint about your course of study, you should try to resolve the problem by speaking with a staff member in the International Centre at your Institute. The staff member will discuss your complaint and possible courses of action with you. If you are unable to resolve your complaint, you may then make a formal complaint at your Institute. Refund Policy – Student Visa Holders Only

The policy below will apply to students who are the holders of a student visa. It does not apply for enrolments where the student is on a Dependant Visa.

All ETI refunds will be made in accordance with the refund table and conditions contained in this policy.

A notice of withdrawal may be accepted as grounds for a partial refund of fees if the supporting documentary evidence can substantiate a claim due to:

- > illness or disability
- > death of a close family member (parent, sibling, spouse, child) or
- > political or civil event that prevents a student continuing a program

Refund Requests

Refund applications for full or partial refunds must:

- > be made in writing using the *ETI Refund and Withdrawal form*
- > be accompanied by *Request for Release form* (if applicable)
- > set out the reasons for the request
- > be forwarded to: admissions.eti@dtwd.wa.gov.au.

The information provided by the student must include:

- > the student's payment details
- > the student's signature (or guardian if under 18 years)
- > all supporting documents relevant to the claim

Refund applications will not be processed where the signature on the *Refund and Withdrawal form* does not match the student's signature as shown on other documents provided by the student for admission to ETI.

For minors the *Refund and Withdrawal form* must be signed by the nominated Parent/Guardian.

The date of the notification for refund is the date the completed form is received by ETI or date/time of email.

All amounts due to ETI must be paid before any refund is made. Any outstanding amounts will be deducted from the refund due.

All refunds will be paid in Australian dollars \$AUD, where this is not possible refunds will be paid in United States dollars \$USD. Fees paid by credit card will be refunded to the same credit card.
